Having recently met with representatives from Granite Construction, we would like to state our support for the Liberty Quarry project, which will benefit our region in many ways.

This new local source of aggregate will reduce the number of trucks transporting construction materials through our city, while local businesses and public agencies will see construction costs fall because there will no longer be a need to import these materials from distant sources. In addition to creating easier commutes for residents, the reduction in truck traffic will bring tremendous improvements to local air quality.
